

DFW LABOR MARKET UPDATE JULY 2022



Summary


July's labor market statistics continue to show signs of growth for DFW but are markedly more subdued than previous month-to-month gains, with only 5,800 new jobs added since June. The biggest employment change was seen in **government**, which experienced a decrease of **16,100** jobs from last month. Due to this decline, this sector is the only one to have fewer jobs than it did a year ago in July 2021, with all other sectors seeing relative increases. When viewing all industries, the Metroplex appears to be surpassing the national average in terms of total nonfarm growth, with 7.2% versus 4.0% respectively from last year.

DFW continues to keep pace with the national unemployment rate, both holding at roughly 3.8%. Meanwhile, the consumer price indices indicate the metro has seen slower growth from the previous reporting period of May, suggesting prices might be stabilizing. This would be in line with all other evaluated geographies, which have held relatively stable CPIs from June with little to no change. Because this data at the metropolitan level is only available every other month it might take additional time to observe the wider trends for our region.

From the jobs posting perspective, this month shows a return to growth, with 7.4% more postings added since June. Leading this growth was **registered nurses**, which have steadily seen month-over-month increases since May, placing them as the most posted occupation for July. Postings related to education have seen an interesting change during this time period with tutors and preschool teachers having some of the fastest growth in postings while postsecondary and middle school teachers were some of the fastest declining from June to July. It will be interesting to observe what changes occur as we get closer to the beginning of a new school year in August and September later this year.


DFW – Job Postings vs. Nonfarm Jobs




Unemployment Rates* in DFW, Texas, and U.S.
